Conference Reports

2016 State Conference / ECR Conference Report D10, 11 and 28, Carl

The last Wrap-up planning meeting as a committee was held August 28th at the Lake Zurich PD.

All but a couple committee reports have been received and are being complied for the Final Conference report which we hope to submit within the next couple weeks. Each of the committee members did a terrific job in their individual areas to make the conference a tremendous success.

Final conference attendance numbers are 537 Attendees, 318 Banquet Meals, 176 Box Lunches, 204 Ice Cream Socials, and 16 Delegate Breakfasts.

There are a couple expenses yet to be paid but all indications are the conference was self-supporting. We will be returning the \$3000 in seed money provided by the area and never requested or used the seed money provided by the region. Once the final expenses have been paid we will make distributions according to the guidelines to GSO, the three Illinois areas, and Al-Anon. Based on current bank balance, the excess funds from the conference are estimated to be just under \$2000.

The website www.aailcon.org is still live and can be used for comments and feedback to the committee. As soon as it's available, we plan to add a link to the 2017 State Conference website.

It was a wonderful experience to see a number of individuals, "People who would not normally mix" as the book says, come together to form such a tremendous team. It is with tremendous gratitude on behalf of the entire committee that I thank the area and the region for the opportunity to have been of service.

At the mic:

Rich – we've never hosted an ECR regional conference – don't splits go to areas plus the region somehow based on split attendance? We should reconsider distribution of funds. Before we move money, let's consider it.

Carl – based on guidelines, the split is 5 ways – Alanon, GSO, Conference, no mention to sending to other areas. Distribution to attending areas would be difficult to determine.

Marcia – treasurer would know if we received any funding from a past regional conference

Judd – don't know

Rich – dispersed to regional treasurer, not to other areas.

2017 Big Book Conference Report D71 – Tracy

2nd meeting on Aug 22nd. Program committee is working on speakers. 10/28 2017 is tentative date. Asked for theme ideas – have a few to choose from. Groups will vote for final theme on 9/26.

New Business

Motion by Heather S concerning service terms be limited to not more than three terms for appointed positions.

Motion: Change "more than one term" to "not more than three terms" under Appointed Positions in the NIA handbook.

Currently the NIA handbook reads, for appointed positions: Appointed committee members may serve in the same position for more than one term. (p.47)

If accepted, the NIA handbook would read: *Appointed committee members may serve in the same position for not more than three terms.*

Reasoning: AA lives by the spirit of rotation. That rotation is usually suggested as two years. But there are some positions that have a certain amount of technical expertise. It can be difficult to find a person willing to serve at the Area level who has the needed skills. Holding one position for longer than 6 years is ego inflating. If a person serves 6 years in one position often the person takes ownership of the position. The person serving will not relinquish the position. Another may want to serve. But there is no mechanism for the smooth transfer of the position. The situation becomes personal. Possible qualified candidates for the position will not consider the position because the person currently holding the position "has always done it". A person serving in one position for 3 times longer than the suggested term of service also tends to aggregate power. Other servants, rotating in, have never seen anyone else doing the job. The person holding the position aggregates power because most people will not disagree with someone who has held the position for so long when that ideas about the responsibilities of the position are discussed.

At the mic:

Questions:

Barbara H – what positions does this apply to? Concepts editor, co-editor, and webmaster?

Marilyn – those are the only three

Rob – these people serve at request of Area Chair, correct? Lack of role change should occur with Area Chair, correct?

Marilyn – there is nothing in our Area handbook that

Rob – don't we put ourselves at risk if we can't find servants with specialized skills

Kyle – group question – is there something to handle when specialized position is vacant. Agree with term limits but need process to ensure it can be filled with suitable servant.

Jennifer – for smooth transfer, is there anything in place to appoint alternates who can learn from person who currently has position?

Marilyn – we do have an alternate concepts editor and webmaster, not archivist

Mike – are we going to make positions elected now? Are we taking responsibility to make these appointments away from Area Chair? There's no reason the Chair can't reappoint positions when they want or need to.

Ernest – limit to three terms, per lifetime? Could someone be reappointed at any point?

Heather – tried to keep it simple – current handbook reads – may serve for more than one term (with no limit). Very specific motion to address one line in the handbook. This would avoid area chair having to get into conflict about asking someone to step down if they have served for a long time.

Mike – agree with motion, since it is an open-ended appointment, it leaves area open to risk of not having adequate replacements. If we know when terms are up, we can better prepare.

Dan – are there alternates appointed as well?

Heather

Discussion:

Kelly – I was Area Chair – 6 years of doing anything you would think someone would want to rotate. Webmaster wanted to get out so we created alternate appointments. Limits would make it easier for Area Chair.

Kevin – concern is after 3 terms, we don't have someone to step up. We have web admin for district. It was a hard role to fill. Chair should be seeking others to do the job. If no one is interested, who will do it? Ernest – DCMs also have responsibility to appoint or have conflict when needing to ask someone to step down. We deal with these types of conflicts at the local level.

Cheryl – Our current web admin, John – recently ported our web to a new program. John is working with districts to create more of a committee. It may not to be a job that requires extra special skills.

Tom – Speak in favors – encourage rotation. As large of an Area as we are, it is inflated ego to think there may not be people available to fill these positions. If someone cannot step up and we are missing it, someone will step up. If not, maybe we don't need it.

Ray – We need a bit more background. Background doesn't offer specific detail for positions we are talking about. When I was Chair, I went out and looked for individuals to serve. I have been appointed twice and have already been asked if I would serve again. I would be willing to serve. The AA Guidelines – Archives, from shared experience, we know that it takes considerable time to become familiar.... guidelines suggest that the Area Archivist could not be a rotating position.

Robert – in favor of rotation, the thing that bothers me about the motion is that it assumes our chair doesn't have the guts to appoint someone.

Barb – speak against this motion. I would like to leave it to discretion of trusted servants, Area Chair to decide if position needs to rotate.

Rob – already given authority to chair to deal with situation, we are at risk by adjudicating it.

Ray – I put some Archivist reports out today to get a sense of the breadth of the work. As the archivist, when first rotation ended, was to search out the committee in the breakout meetings, ask who would be willing to serve next? Find our own replacement. We could consider an alternate archivist – in lieu of that, I've already begun asking folks to be willing to serve.

Jennifer – concern – it would need to be balanced with approach to train alternates. There doesn't seem to be systematic approach to train alternates. This could cover concerns about the role staying empty and honor the spirit of rotation. It's hard to vote on term limits without approach to training alternates.

Rich – maybe change language to no more than two limits

Mike-I would make it up to chairman to reappoint those positions every two years. We don't need to make it more complex. Let's leave it as simple as it already is.

Dan – call the question

Marilyn calls for vote to call the question, go to vote. Vote requires substantial unanimity to pass.

VOTING RESULTS

In favor – 25, not in favor – 43 – motion fails

Minority opinion (those who voted yes):

Marcia – in the instance where a role is empty, someone can call a motion to have someone appointed. I know an Area Chair who asked someone to stand down and that person would not. That leaves the Chair in a stuck position.

No one wishes to change vote-motion fails.

Motion by Panel 64 past Delegate concerning the timing of the NIA Spring Assembly Conference, presented by Cheryl V. This was discussed at the August Summer Committee meeting and was approved by a substantially unanimous vote of the Area Committee. Not a motion to be voted on at the Assembly. Assembly gave committee authority to approve it – it did pass. This detail will be added to our planning procedures.

At the mic:

Mike H – why doesn't Assembly have the ability to hear the rest of the discussion from committee meeting regarding this topic?

Marilyn – WE considered it at committee meeting. In our handbook, changes to certain portions of our handbook can be made by committee, as per prior assembly approval.

Mike H – one suggestion was that for a considerable period that changes be made to when the events are held. That was part of the discussion. Assembly should consider additional discussion points.

Robert – my report addresses this very thing. As DCM breakout chair for Assembly, 21 were present – talked about how to handle people at district meetings that bully others. We talked about this spring assembly conference. Some concern is that the way it has been run recently that the new people rotating into service, the spring is their first assembly. They don't have a chance to meet people given there are no breakout meetings. People express that they don't like that there are no breakouts. Should we separate the two events again? Should we move conference to the summer to spread out the events? In state conference hosting years, combine spring and state conferences to minimize the number of events. I have asked DCMs to take options and ideas back and discuss with groups and bring feedback.

Service/Administrative Committee Reports (2 minutes each)

Accessibilities, Terry

Had 4 people in breakout session. It was suggested that treatment, PI and CPC, and special needs cooperate alongside each other. We will also emphasize to district chairs to contact assisted living facilitates. District 22 chair has started a new meeting at physical rehab facility. Huntly deer path assisted living has a meeting already. We're trying to get some things going. Not much happening yet. If you want do anything with special needs in your district, bring ideas to your district and if treatment wants to collaborate, get together with us.

Answering Service, Patrick

Since the last area meeting attended, Bonnie and I have visited area districts to find out different ways that they are implementing their answering services.

Much to our surprise, and delight, we have found that it seems to be a little different in every district. Some use a cell phone passed from one volunteer to another, while others share the expense of an answering service between several districts, and some use an answering service designated just for that specific district. While at these meetings we also gathered information on how many calls were being received each month. Again to our delight we've found that even though the amount of calls may vary, they are being handled in true 12th step fashion everywhere we have inquired.

The district meetings we have attended are Districts 73, 40, 22, 12, 61, 21, and 10.

At all meetings attended, we have witnessed the true meaning of service and fellowship. We can all rest assured that our districts are on top of their game when it comes to carrying the message to the newcomer, or in some cases, helping a visitor from out of town, find their way to a meeting.

We plan to visit the rest of the districts in NIA20, to continue our inquiries in the near future, as time permits.

Archives, Barbara

I will talk about committee meeting today – 7 people in attendance. There is a form on website now about how to collect group histories. D43 has developed a new form that is focused on history. We will be changing the form on the website to use the new one George in D43 has developed. Term limits and succession – for the website, we would like to work with webmaster to propose to have an Archives area on the site.

Archivist, Ray

Doing a lot of scanning to preserve old material. Storage and accessibility becomes thee question. There are about 19.5 G out of 1 T of space. Process of preserving old stuff includes cassettes – we have some old cassettes from the 50s, 60s, etc. We have talked with Judd, treasurer that will allow for preserving old audio cassettes in a current digital format. We need a webpage under new website. NIA collection, resources, history, are possible tabs. The cloud is where a lot of people are going for storage. We need to start to addressing new technology for storage.

Bridging the Gap, Dan

We went to BTG workshop, great weekend. We learned and made good connections. The databases we have tried have crashed. Found a database by BTG workshop chair that works. Dan will pursue options and present solution to upcoming Area meetings.

Grapevine released the book 12 Traditions on September 2nd. It is available for \$10.99 for 1-4 books or \$10.50 each for 5 or more books.

On July 15th I had the opportunity to compleate a phone survey with a member of the Grapevine Editorial Advisory Board about how the Grapevine can be of better service to our are and how it is currently used in Area 20.

Urbano and Javier had the privilege of attending the Hispanic National Convention in Dallas, TX from September 2nd-4th. They had a La Viña breakout room to discuss issues affecting La Viña. One line in that essay is, "We have only to seek these folks out and trust them to serve us".

Another line in his essay that stands out to me today is "Somewhere in our literature there is a statement to the effect: Our leaders do not drive by mandate; they lead by example". In effect, we are saying to them, "Act for us, but don't boss us". This seems to be a tough task for me. I have read a lot of guidelines this year. The Service Manual included. At times, I feel, that these guidelines are mandates. That they need to be followed to the letter. I'm learning that it's just not true.

Another line in Concept 9 is: When a leader power-drives us badly, we rebel; but when he too meekly becomes an order-taker, and he exercises no judgement of his own, well, he really isn't a leader at all.

Since the last committee meeting I've been given the opportunity to participate in the State Conference, 4 Big Book planning meetings, 2 Spring Assembly Conference committee meetings. We have some great leaders here and some yet to come. All we need is the experience.

Delegates Report Fall Assembly September 17, 2016

Hello All,

Today we will be electing our candidate for East Central Regional Trustee. The last time NIA 20 had a Regional Trustee was Jack O., 1998 to 2002. It would be nice to have the East Central Regional Trustee come from Area 20 for the next four year term. The 2016 Final Reports from the GSC are here. I am hoping to get as many to the districts as possible today. If you are from a district that your DCM is not here, please take the reports for your district. As always the less I take back home the better.

I am still keeping fairly busy with my Delegate talks. Since the Summer Committee meeting I visited district 73 on August 19th and District 72 on August 27th to share on my experiences at the 2016 General Service Conference. I have noticed that almost all of the presentations I have done are a little different. A few wanted the full power point presentation, some wanted my experience of what I did and not too deeply into the agenda items, and others wanted a little of both. As it stands now I have one more district to visit, district 21 on September 20th. I have traveled about 1,160 miles so far and I enjoyed every mile of it to share about my experience at the 2016 GSC.

In my talks I mentioned the presentations that were given by the Panel 65 or second year delegates. The presentations come out of the Agenda committee and brought to the floor for conference approval to become advisory actions. I received a loving invitation to give a presentation on, "Apathy and the Power of the Purse," at the 2017 GSC. So far that presentation has been the hardest for me to write. Thank goodness for deadlines.

On August 20th, I had participated in a workshop put on by Robert S. our Area alternate delegate which was hosted by districts 22 and 23. There was lots of discussion about the various service committees and a pretty good turnout.

August 12-14th I attended the Illinois State Conference/ Regional Conference which was held at the Pheasant Run Resort in St. Charles. I was a co-chair of a Grapevine Writing Stories workshop which had about 20 members in attendance. That was the first one I had ever attended and I thought it went well. It was a little hard for me to just sit there and be quiet while members wrote their stories but I did get a lot of reading done. I also was on a sponsorship panel with a few members from a meeting that really dove deep into the big book. I attended a few East Central Region delegate events such as an early 7:00 am breakfast and then a luncheon. I had the privilege of chairing the Sunday morning session. All the panels that I attended were well prepared and informative. Thank you districts 10, 12 and 28 for a job well done.

Trustees' Archives Committee

Proposal for new A.A.W.S. Book: The committee briefly discussed a proposal for a new A.A.W.S.book on Bill W.'s General Service Conference talks from 1951 - 1970. The committee agreed to continue the discussion and looks forward to receiving additional background information for their October 2016 meeting.

<u>Trustees' Committee on Cooperation With the Professional</u> Community/Treatment/Accessibilities

C.P.C. Publications: The committee reviewed the Conference committee's Additional Consideration for the trustees' committee to continue discussing the pamphlet "Three Talks to Medical Societies by Bill W." The chair appointed a subcommittee to continue discussion on the pamphlet, "Three Talks to Medical Societies by Bill W." The committee also requested that the subcommittee continue discussion on the development of service material providing information about A.A. to mental health care professionals

Trustees' Committee on Corrections

New Corrections Video "A New Freedom": The committee discussed and agreed on the usefulness of a 2-3 minute version of "A New Freedom" given the current digital landscape and the desire for "short bites." The committee also noted the value of shorter versions as a training tool for professionals and students of sociology or criminology. The staff member will gather input from members and other viewers focusing on the length of the video and its most important elements, and then report back.

<u>Trustees' Committee</u> on literature

Pamphlet "The Twelve Traditions Illustrated": The committee reviewed the 2016 Conference Advisory to update the pamphlet "The Twelve Traditions Illustrated." The committee requested that the Publishing Department begin the initial process of updating the pamphlet and prepare a "mock-up" of two or three Traditions for review at the October 2016 meeting.

Expanding availability of "plain-language" recovery literature: The committee reviewed the 2016 Additional Committee Consideration regarding expanding the availability of "plain-language" recovery literature. Following discussion, the committee agreed to continue discussions at the October 2016 meeting.

<u>Trustees' Committee on Public Information</u>

Google-for-Non-Profits: In response to a 2016 Conference Committee on Public Information recommendation that resulted in an Advisory Action, the chair appointed a subcommittee. to oversee the development of a plan to implement a Google-for-Non- Profits account and the scope of services to be utilized.

Trustees' Committee on Finance and Budgetary

Net literature sales were \$6,788,568, approximately \$345,580 (5.4%) greater than budget and \$341,639 (5.3%) greater than the first six months of last year.

The committee was advised that for the first six months of this year, Seventh Tradition contributions of \$3,441,484 were received, \$232,953 more than the first six months of last year, and \$257,236 greater than budget for the period. With the exception of January all months of this year have shown contributions greater than both budget and the same month in 2015. While July is not yet finished, it also appears that it will be a good month.

Registrar's Report

Fellowship New Vision database

Fellowship New Vision database (FNV) was developed by the General Service Office and released for use by the areas in May, 2007. FNV is a web based tool and because of that, updates are immediate. FNV also provides each area, via their Area Registrar, access to update certain area information directly into the database. Because FNV is an online-real time database, what is entered by either the areas or the GSO Records department is available for immediate use.

Four times a year the Alternate Registrar will be sending to the DCM and the District Secretary a document of all of the groups in their district. The last column is where updates can be entered. GSRs can update group information by working with their DCM or district secretary or by completing a group information change form which they can find online at http://www.aa-nia.org/forms.html.

Group information includes group name, group number, area, district, history dates, meeting locations and times, and complete group contact information. District information, on the other hand, includes district service positions and contact information for those elected to those positions and Area information is similar to district information but at the area-level.

This information is the key to communication throughout the A.A. general service structure. GSO uses group information to send information kits to new GSRs, copies of *Box 459*, the GSO quarterly newsletter, and GSO quarterly reports. Similarly, the area uses the information to send to the group *Concepts*, the NIA newsletter, and area assembly meeting minutes. This information is also used by GSO to send information kits to District and area-level committee chairs to help orient them to their service positions and by area service committee chairs to communicate with their district counterparts.
