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# 2022 Area 20, NIA Primanry Purpose Registry Motions

- The Primary Purpose Basic (PPB) covers expenses that occur every year. These include all costs for things like Area Assemblies and Committee meetings, printing of minutes and the newsletter Concepts, insurance, orientations, conferences, etc.
- The first section of the register, The Primary Purpose Basic (PPB) section, lists and funds and facilitates service activities that are described in the Duties and Responsibilities section of these guidelines.
- · The PPB provides funding for all the activities listed in the Duties and Responsibilities section of this handbook.
- The second section, the Primary Purpose Motion (PPM) section, lists and funds. additional service activities, resulting from motions delegated approved by the Assembly to its trusted servants. PPM activities may be proposed by any member of the Fellowship but most often originate within a service committee. Ideally, all proposals are considered by a service or administrative committee prior to presentation to the Area

PPMs are approved by a substantially unanimous (2/3 majority) vote of the Assembly. Upon PPM approval by the Assembly, the Treasurer or Alternate Treasurer adds the PPM to the Primary Purpose Register, the responsible trusted servant performs the service activity, and the Area Treasurer is authorized to reimburse associated expenses.

In the primary purpose finance model, activities need not have a time frame and so may continue from one year to the next or even from one rotation to the next, thus providing continuity for service committees. As such, the primary purpose finance model is not a budget in the traditional sense. No individual or committee at the Area level has a line item budget they are free to spend. Instead, the basic register provides for activities that trusted servants are expected to participate in (see the Duties and Responsibilities document) and the motions section of the register provides for activities pursued by service committees in their effort to carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

#### Summary

Consistently using the Primary Purpose Register as the financial communication vehicle defocuses the Assembly on money by focusing more transparently on service. It improves quantity and quality of communication between the Assembly and its trusted servants. The Treasurer is individually responsible only for the treasurer role — to manage cash and to pay the bills. The Finance Committee has responsibility for the controller role — to plan and manage the treasury and the time-sequence for service activities on the Assembly's behalf. Detailed guidelines for each service activity provide common direction to trusted servants responsible for service activities and to the committee responsible for paying the expenses for those activities. Annual budgeting, mid-year budget increases, and the "new service activity" process, are simplified. The annual budget rollercoaster that was common previously is gone: we endure no more quibbling over contributions to the General Service Office or scrambling to do something at the end of a year to spend area contributions "at home". Clearer delegation of these financial responsibilities by the Assembly has shifted the area's focus from money to service.

# Delegate's Report

Thanks to everyone for being here today, especially those that might be new. This report includes updates from the General Service Office as well as updates from the Trustees committees, GSO Staff, the General Service Board, Grapevine and AAWS.

There is also an accompanying slide deck that follows closely to but not exactly to this written report. Not all content in this report is shown in slide deck so please review this report in it's entirely for all the latest updates. I have added an (pp) when there is an accompanying slide. Additionally, please be aware there are several hyperlinks in this document that contain links to additional documents which contain full reports with additional details.

# (pp)RECENT ACTIVITIES-

It's been a busy time since my last report at the Fall Committee meeting on October 8. Some of the "major" events are listed below-

- October 2022 I visited several different groups and logged almost 600 miles to facilitate <u>membership surveys</u> for groups in Bolingbrook, Crystal Lake, Elgin, Palatine, Kirkland, and Henry. I also appreciate the assistance of Lisa S., Erik L. and Cheryl V. who helped to get the surveys done in West Chicago, Hinsdale, and Antioch respectively. Area 20 sent approximately 200 surveys back!
- October 18 Participated in the <u>Conference Finance Committee</u> zoom call to review the potential agenda items for Finance. We agreed to forward the two items below to the Finance Trustees committee for consideration on the agenda.

PAI 89- Analyze and change all current resources produced and maintained by AA World Service, AA Grapevine, La Viña and G.S.O. communications to clarify that the General Service Board ("GSB") is the entity which receives the voluntary A.A. contributions. Ensure all new literature, digital resources and released publications maintain the clarity and consistency of the General Service Board as the recipient of our Voluntary A.A. Contributions ("Contributions").

# (pp)GENERAL SERVICE CONFERENCE

 <u>Proposed Agenda Items</u>-There were 184 proposed agenda items submitted for consideration. The GSB has asked for feedback from the Delegates and will be releasing the final list after the January GSB board weekend meeting on approximately February 15th. This background will be distributed by our Alternate Delegate Erik L. and Pre-General Service Conference virtual workshops will begin in late March. A quick breakdown of the agenda item type can be found in the accompanying slide deck.

# (pp)FINANCE

- Year to date contributions are \$8,354,054. This represents 76% of the 2022
  reforecast budget of \$11,000,000 and is \$12,673 more than last year. About 55%
  of annual contributions arrive in the second half of the year. However, we are at
  risk of not meeting the reforecast budget.
- Year to date gross literature sales are \$10,267,395. This represents 93% of the 2022 reforecast budget of \$11,000,000 and is \$591,031 more than last year. September marked the fourth consecutive month of gross literature sales in excess of \$1 million.
- Year to date gross margin (sales minus cost of goods sold) is \$4,313,754 which is 80% of the 2022 budget of \$5,390,000 and \$1,352,095 less than last year.
- Total operating expense year to date is \$14,016,804 which is 80% of the reforecast budget amount of \$17,569,432 and \$1,141,573 more than last year driven by a resumption in travel.
- Operating deficit to date is \$916,020 compared to a reforecast budget operating deficit of \$855,032 and an operating surplus of \$1,396,700 at this time last year.

### (pp)EAST CENTRAL REGION

# East Central Region (ECR)

Our Service Manual states that A Region is "A grouping of several areas from which a regional trustee comes to the board of trustees. There are six regions in the US and two in Canada. Area 20 is part of the East Central Region often referred to as ECR. There are 14 Areas that make up ECR from the states of Illinois, Wisconsin, Ohio. Indiana, and Michigan.

Our ECR Trustee Cathi C. continues to host monthly ECR Delegate Meetings that provide updates and well as opportunities for the 14 Areas to come together. Cathi is serving as the Vice Chair for AAWS Board and after the 73rd GSC will become chair of AAWS

### FINANCIAL UPDATE TO OCTOBER 31, 2022

- Total operating expense year to date is \$14,016,804 which is 80% of the reforecast budget amount of \$17,569,432 and \$1,141,573 more than last year driven by a resumption in travel.

- As of November 15, operating cash of 0.91 months of expenses was on hand.
   As of October 31, the reserve fund balance net of Grapevine subscription liability is







### **NEW BUSINESS:**

• **2022 State Conference Budget** – Operating loss of \$12,537.42 due to lack of area policy committee oversight and decisions that were made by the hosting committee. Everything has been paid. Debt is absorbed by 3 Illinois Areas.

#### 2022 Illinois State Conference Loss.

After all of the numbers were processed the final loss for the 2022 Illinois State Conference was:

#### TOTAL operating Loss \$12,537.42

- ISC Seed Money \$3000.00
- ECRC Seed Money \$3000.00
- Operating Loss \$6,537.42

This loss is a result of both lack of oversight by myself and that the Area 20 State Conference Hosting Committee did not lock down food costs before setting their prices. The loss was a result of the Food and Beverage gap.

All bills have been paid by area 20 and the committees' books are closed. Seed money payments to next year's hosting committees will be made by Area 20 as soon as an address is received and is not contingent on receipt of any money from the other areas.

The Illinois State Conference is hosted by a committee that rotates between the 3 Illinois Areas (19,20,21). The conference is governed by the Illinois State Conference Policy Committee. This committee is made up by the Chair and Delegate from each of the areas. The ultimate cost or profit from the conference is shared between the 3 areas, per the ISC guidelines. This group met and proposed this is how the deficit will be covered.

During the ECR monthly Delegate meeting the ISC loss was discussed and in order to rebuild the ECRC seed money lost by the event it was proposed that each region would cover 1/14 of the ECRC seed money at \$214.29 each. This was received as a viable option.

This leaves the ISC with \$9,527.42 left to be covered. \$3000 State Conference Seed Money and \$6537.42 additional loss.

- ECRC seed money \$3,000 / 14 regional areas = \$214.29 per ECR area.
- ISC seed money \$3,000 / 3 Illinois areas = \$1,000 per ISC area.
- \$6,537.42 / 3 areas = \$2,179.14 per ISC area.

Net cost per each regional area (excluding ISC areas) = \$214.29 Net cost per ISC three Areas = \$3,393.43 (\$2,179.14 + \$1,000 + \$214.29)

Each Area Chair will present to their respective areas at the winter assemblies. All payments to cover the above loss will go to Area 20 as all bills have been paid.

To date some of the ECRC money has been received. All money will be accounted for by the treasurer and reported in future assemblies.

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- The Primary Purpose Basic (PPB) covers expenses that occur every year. These include all costs for things like Area Assemblies and Committee meetings, printing of minutes and the newsletter Concepts, insurance, orientations, conferences, etc.
- The first section of the register, The Primary Purpose Basic (PPB) section, lists and funds and facilitates service activities that are
  described in the Duties and Responsibilities section of these guidelines.
- · The PPB provides funding for all the activities listed in the Duties and Responsibilities section of this handbook.
- The second section, the Primary Purpose Motion (PPM) section, lists and funds. additional service activities, resulting from motions
  delegated approved by the Assembly to its trusted servants. PPM activities may be proposed by any member of the Fellowship but
  most often originate within a service committee. Ideally, all proposals are considered by a service or administrative committee prior to
  presentation to the Area Committee.

PPMs are approved by a substantially unanimous (2/3 majority) vote of the Assembly. Upon PPM approval by the Assembly, the Treasurer or Alternate Treasurer adds the PPM to the Primary Purpose Register, the responsible trusted servant performs the service activity, and the Area Treasurer is authorized to reimburse associated expenses.

In the primary purpose finance model, activities need not have a time frame and so may continue from one year to the next or even from one rotation to the next, thus providing continuity for service committees. As such, the primary purpose finance model is not a budget in the traditional sense. No individual or committee at the Area level has a line item budget they are free to spend. Instead, the basic register provides for activities that trusted servants are expected to participate in (see the Duties and Responsibilities document) and the motions section of the register provides for activities pursued by service committees in their effort to carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

#### Summary

Consistently using the Primary Purpose Register as the financial communication vehicle defocuses the Assembly on money by focusing more transparently on service. It improves quantity and quality of communication between the Assembly and its trusted servants. The Treasurer is individually responsible only for the treasurer role – to manage cash and to pay the bills. The Finance Committee has responsibility for the controller role – to plan and manage the treasury and the time-sequence for service activities on the Assembly's behalf. Detailed guidelines for each service activity provide common direction to trusted servants responsible for service activities and to the committee responsible for paying the expenses for those activities. Annual budgeting, mid-year budget increases, and the "new service activity" process, are simplified. The annual budget rollercoaster that was common previously is gone: we endure no more quibbling over contributions to the General Service Office or scrambling to do something at the end of a year to spend area contributions "at home". Clearer delegation of these financial responsibilities by the Assembly has shifted the area's focus from money to service.

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 Chris E. brought up a list of items that are missing from the proposed budget, including Spanish translation, eligible groups for certain events, reimbursable items. Allen asked Chris to provide a written list for Allen to consider.

Motion to approve 2023 proposed budget was passed unanimously.
