Motion: District 40 requests that Area 20 submit the following agenda item for the 76th General Service Conference:

(1) Submit a clear and concisely worded motion.

It is moved to return to using a plane blue binding with embossed letters (Alcoholics Anonymous) in the same color, for the hard copy "Big Book," either with or without the dust cover.

(2) What problem does this proposed item address?

Prior to the removal of the dust cover and binding that reproduced the dust cover a person could remove the dust cover and carry the book around, in public, and remain anonymous. The new, dust coverless, version does not allow for this. If carried in public anyone can easily see that it is the book Alcoholics Anonymous. The proposed agenda item would allow people to carry the book and maintain their anonymity. The proposed agenda item has no intention to force providing a dust cover. If determined that the cost saving of not providing a dust cover is significant then continue to not provide one.
