### Delegate's Corner

#### **Greetings Area 20! -**

It is certainly an honor to be serving as your Panel 74 delegate for the next 2 years. I am both grateful and humbled for this opportunity to serve our area. I'm also very appreciative to Chris D., our past delegate for his help and willingness to answer a bunch of my questions. I am also very pleased to work with Lisa S., our Alternate Delegate, as I know her enthusiastic AA spirit will definitely help me in doing the best job I can.

As spring is just around the corner, so is the 74<sup>th</sup> Annual General Service Conference. We use the term "panel" a lot in general service to indicate the time period for the particular service rotation. So, as your Panel 74 Delegate, I'll be serving at both the 74<sup>th</sup> and 75<sup>th</sup> General Service Conference. After my term is up, we'll be electing a Panel 76 delegate as Area 20 (Northern Illinois) elects its Area positions in even years. Other Areas, like the other 2 in Illinois, Area 19 (Chicago) and Area 21 (Southern Illinois), have their elections in odd years. So, at the General Service Conference in New York in April, there will be a mix of first year and second year delegates from across the US and Canada – 93 in total.

#### RECENT CONFERENCE ATTENDANCE

Last weekend (Feb 9-11) at the Conference of Delegates Past & Present, I had the opportunity to visit with a few of the past delegates from Illinois and our neighboring states along with the other 13 delegates from the other areas in our East Central Region. At this event, held in Muncie, Indiana, the new delegates including myself, participated in a **mock conference** and met with our Regional Trustee and GSO staff to ask questions and to prepare ourselves for the week-long General Service Conference in New York in April. I left the weekend conference feeling better prepared and encouraged by our past delegates.

#### **UPCOMING AGENDA ITEMS**

I recently sent out the list of the 83 individual items that will comprise most of the upcoming agenda at the General Service Conference. (At the time of writing this article, I have not yet received the background material on these items, although that will be sent out as soon as I receive it.) Across the US and Canada, our entire AA fellowship will have the opportunity discuss and give input on these agenda items between now and April 14. Each Area has their own process to coordinate this effort. In Area 20, much of the fellowship's input has historically been given and received at our Pre-General Service Conference Workshop. Over the last 4 years, our Area has also held a series of individual Zoom meetings a week or two prior to the Pre-GSC Workshop to allow for additional discussion on each section of the Agenda. Last year, for example, we had 11 additional meetings, totaling 21.5 hours, prior to our full day Pre-GSC workshop. While the use of these zoom meetings started in 2020 as the result of the pandemic, they seem to offer an efficient way to review these materials and I expect we may continue with this format this year as well. Lisa S. will be sending out a schedule for these meetings along with details of our Pre-GSC Workshop which is scheduled for March 23.

#### **FUTURE THOUGHTS**

Through the entire process, it will be my goal to hear from as many of our members as possible and understand the Area's thoughts, and experience on the items to be discussed at the General Service Conference. I would encourage all our area's groups, districts, etc. to pay particular attention to those items of interest to them and share their perspective. As reflected in our 4<sup>th</sup> Concept, the more participation we have, the more unified our fellowship becomes.

Lastly, I'd like to say to please reach out at any time if I can be of help or if there is something you'd like to share. I'll do my best to be accessible and to remain teachable.


